


# Extraterritorial Reach of GDPR – what are the practical impacts on countries outside the EU?

### **Practical Impacts I**

- General first reaction: resistance. Why should EU law apply to and be implemented in non-EU countries?
- However countries with adequate data protection level today will most likely amend their current law in order to further count on the adequacy decision of the EU.
- E.g. Switzerland is doing so by revising its current law by 2019. 70%-80% of the GDPR will be adopted in the new Swiss Data Protection Law ("Swiss DPA").
- Since cross-border exchange between Switzerland and EU is intensive, most Swiss companies are subject to the GDPR. This raises many practical questions.
- Circumvention of GDPR is it possible and worth the efforts?
  - No use of language of a member state
  - No use of currency of a member state
  - No mentioning of customers of a member state
  - No target advertising to consumers in a member state and no use of cookies
  - Abolishing of all data from EU consumers/citizens on the entity's servers



#### **Practical Impacts II**

- Coexistence of Swiss DPA and GDPR
  - Swiss data subjects vs. EU data subjects: must controller apply different processing rules and rights to Swiss and EU data subjects?
  - Which supervisory authority is competent, if Swiss DPA and GDPR apply?
  - What about the "ne bis in idem"- principle if sanctions are imposed both under Swiss DPA and GDPR?
  - Do the references in the GDPR to the law of the member states apply to Swiss controllers?
- Coexistence of GDPR and international agreements
  - GDPR does not affect the validity of existing international agreements that have already been concluded prior to GDPR
  - E.g. Mutual Legal Assistance Treaty ("MLAT") still applies
- Enforcement of GDPR sanctions and fines on Swiss territory
  - Credibility of GDPR at stake if no enforcement possible outside EU
  - Role of representative?
  - Blocking Statutes
  - Cooperation agreements between DPAs?
